

Arrival Information

Thank you for registering for the 2026 Flying Scot Midwinter Championship at the Sarasota Sailing Squadron! Some important information for your arrival.

- Boats are welcome **to arrive between 9:00 a.m. – 5:00 p.m. on Wednesday, March 4 and Thursday, March 5.**
- All participants, both members and non-members will **park outside the Squadron starting Wednesday – Sunday.** This is because parking spaces inside the club will be utilized for boats, key volunteers and to maintain access for our members to continue to use their boats.
- When you arrive, the Welcome Committee will greet you at the circle at the end of Ken Thompson Parkway and direct you to **park your vehicle with boat attached in the circle,** facing the club and **provide your measurement check list.**
- Once your mast is up, desired gear loaded into your boat, and measurement list completed, **detach your boat from your car and park your vehicle in a parking space for single vehicles.**
- Once parked, **head to a table near the entrance to the Squadron, to get a trailer parking space assignment and trailer tag.** You will have been assigned hoist or ramp launching, depending on your registration preference and date of paid registration. A tractor will deliver your boat to the designated space.
- On-site registration will be **Thursday, March 5, from 12 – 5:30 p.m. in the main club house**
- There is no planned practice race, but you are welcome to go sailing on Wednesday or Thursday.

We are a very active club. There are regattas being held at the Squadron every weekend for the four weeks leading up to the Flying Scot event, and fleet racing occurs nearly every day of the week, including a large women's sailing group on Thursday mornings, so your cooperation is much appreciated. If you desire to bring your boat to the club prior to March 4, **you must contact me to arrange in advance.** If space is available, prior to March 5 or after March 9, there is a daily fee of \$50 or weekly fee of \$75. Your boat will likely not be in its assigned regatta space prior to March 4 or after March 8, and will need to be moved, accordingly.

Flying Scot Fleet 36 and the Sarasota Sailing Squadron are preparing to welcome you! This will be the largest event at the Squadron since the hurricanes. I have every confidence you will all represent the Flying Scot class well and will collaborate with the host fleet, club and fellow competitors to make this event a success. Looking forward to seeing you soon!
