NOTICE OF RACE

Revised 11/2/2025

1 RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing.
- 1.2 The US Sailing Prescriptions to the preamble to Part 5, Section B and RRS 63.1 will not apply.
- 1.3 RRS 60.4(a)(2) is changed as follows: (2) if it alleges a breach of a rule of Part 2 or rule 31 and is from a boat that was not involved in, **and** did not see, the incident, or
- 1.4 All boats shall carry a working VHF radio.

2 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 2.1 This event is open to women skippers and crews.
- 2.2 Boats with or eligible for a WFPHRF rating may enter ("Keelboats").
- 2.3 Boats with a North American Portsmouth Yardstick Rating which are crewed by 2 or more women may enter ("Portsmouth").
- 2.4 Boats without a current PHRF certificate or Portsmouth DPN rating will be assigned a rating.
- 2.5 Expected Divisions are: PHRF Spinnaker A/B/C and Portsmouth; PHRF Racer-Cruiser and Cruising. Divisions assigned will be available at check-in.
- 2.6 Boats shall enter online at the event website <https://www.regattanetwork.com/event/30401>.
- 2.7 Registration closes at 1800 on November 7th. Late registrants may be accepted at the discretion of the Organizers.

3 CREW LIMITATIONS

- 3.1 Keelboats may have one owner representative (either female or male) on board throughout the Regatta; a male representative shall not serve as helmsman, tactician, or crew.
- 3.2 In case of emergency, or jeopardy to the safety or integrity of the boat and nearby competitors, a male on board may render assistance temporarily, but only until the boat is able to keep clear and is under control.
- 3.3 Portsmouth shall have only women on board.

4 FEES

All Boats: \$80.63 (\$75.00 plus 7.5% sales tax)

Fee includes free Signature Drinks, a meal entree, and a swag bag with goodies. All competitors are encouraged to bring a covered side dish for a Pot Luck party after racing.

5 SCHEDULE

0930 Competitors meeting

1030 Base start time for all Divisions in their pursuit race

Prizes to be presented after racing, downstairs. Social/entertainment TBD.

6 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

The sailing instructions will be available on the event website and at check-in.

7 VENUE AND COURSES

- 7.1 The average depth of Hillsborough Bay is between 7 and 9 feet. Due to weather and tides

the average depth may vary. The RC will make every effort to select marks in sufficient water for all boats to round. It is the obligation of the Competitor to be aware of their location and to sail in sufficient depth. Lack of water will not be grounds for Redress.

7.2 All Divisions will race a distance race in Tampa Bay using fixed marks with a pursuit-style start.

8 PENALTY SYSTEM

The Scoring Penalty of RRS 44.3 will apply to all Divisions.

9 SCORING

9.1 One race is scheduled, up to 25 miles, and one race constitutes a regatta.

9.2 All Divisions will be scored using Time-on-Distance.

10 PRIZES

Prizes will be awarded to up to three boats in each Division, depending on entries.

11 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

Sailing is an activity that has an inherent risk of damage and injury. Competitors in this event are participating entirely at their own risk. See RRS 3, Decision to Race. The race organizers (organizing authority, race committee, protest committee, host club, sponsors, or any other organization or official) will not be responsible for damage to any boat or other property or injury, disease, or illness to any competitor, including death, sustained as a result of participation in this event. By participating in this event, each competitor agrees to release the race organizers from any and all liability associated with such competitor's participation in this event to the fullest extent permitted by law.
