SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

1. RULES

1.1 This event will be governed by the rules as defined in the 2025-2028 Racing Rules of Sailing, the prescriptions

of the United States Sailing Association, rules of the South Texas PHRF, the Notice of Regatta, and these Sailing

Instructions.

1.2 Where there is any conflict between the Notice of Race and the Sailing Instructions, the Sailing Instructions

shall be controlling.

1.3 Any questions regarding these Sailing Instructions must be submitted in writing to a race committee

representative. The question and any answer will be posted on the Official Regatta Notice Board.

2. ENTRIES

A boat shall be considered entered if she has completed all registration and paid entry fees by 0930 Saturday

December 13, 2025. Late registration may be accepted at the sole discretion of the CCYC RC. All yachts must

hold a valid 2025 South Texas PHRF rating or temporary rating and will be scored according to that rating. Boats

without a current PHRF rating shall apply to the local PHRF Committee for a temporary rating. Alternatively, the

RC retains the right, at its sole discretion, to assign a temporary PHRF rating for the sole purpose of this regatta.

3. NOTICE TO COMPETITORS

All written Notices to Competitors will be posted on Regatta Network and/or in the CCYC Lanai area.

4. CHANGES IN SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

4.1 Any change in the Sailing Instructions (SI's) will be posted before 09:00 hrs on the day it will take effect.

4.2 The Race Committee (RC) reserves the right to also amend the Sailing Instructions orally and on the water if necessary.

5. SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

5.1 Signals made ashore will be displayed on the RC Boat (S/V Biggles) or shore for a "Wednesday Night".

5.2 When flag AP is displayed ashore, 1 minute' is replaced with 'not less than 60 minutes' in the race signal AP.

6. SCHEDULE

These times are all subject to change at the discretion of the RC and may be changed after the Sailing Instructions

are published:

Saturday December 13, 2025

0800 – 0930 Last minute registrations

0930 Skippers Meeting upstairs CCYC Lanai.

1030 First warning signal, additional races to follow

TBD Awards will be presented after the protest time limit has expired or immediately after the conclusion of

all protest hearings. Estimated time 1400

7. CLASSES AND CLASS FLAGS

7.1 The racing classes for this regatta shall consist of All Sails A and NonSpin/150 A. For the formation of a class, a minimum of two (2) yachts will be required.

7.2 Classes will start in the following order for the starting sequence:

Class Flag

Non-Spin/150 A Green

All Sails A Pink

8. RACING AREA AND COURSE

8.1 The racing area will be the Corpus Christi Marina and Bay

8.2 For Non-Spin/150 class, the course for each race will be posted on a board on the stern of the RC signal boat

when on station at the starting line. The order of marks to be rounded and the side to which each mark is to be

left will be listed sequentially.

8.3 All Sails class will be a W/L course using a windward tetrahedron. Course and distance to the mark will be

listed on the back of the RC boat. The first two races will be a sprint up and back. The third race may be a twolap race using the start/finish pin as the leeward mark unless otherwise notified on the water.

8.4 If an unforeseen shore start is utilized the courses for both classes will be posted at the Wednesday Night

Start Line on the starting board. This option may be used depending on weather and participation.

8.5 To change the next leg of the course, the RC may move the original mark or the finishing line to a new

position.

8.6 The RC may adjust the course during a race, to maintain a fair racecourse, no more than .1nm or 10 degrees

without signaling a course change. This changes RRS 33.

9. MARKS

9.1 Fixed Bay marks may be used as numbered in the race mark map available online at <https://ccmorf.org/ccbay-racemarks/> .

9.2 For a Wednesday Night Start/Finish when passing through the Gap, all navigational aids on station shall be

considered marks of the course and left on the proper side.

9.3 On the course board, the letters "p" or "s" following a mark designated to which side the mark

is to be taken ("p" for port and "s" for starboard).

9.4 An orange tetrahedron and/or orange/white hippity hop could be used as the start/finish pin and leeward mark

respectively.

9.5 No windward offset mark will be used for this course.

10. THE START

10.1 Races will be started using RRS 26.

10.2 The starting line will be between a staff displaying an orange flag on the Race Committee signal boat at the

starboard end of the line and a orange or white mark (Hippity Hop) at the port end or the Wednesday night start

line as briefed at the skippers meeting.

10.3 A boat starting later than 4 minutes after their class's starting signal will be scored "DID NOT

START"(DNS). This modifies rule A5.1 and A5.2.

11. RECALLS

11.1 Individual recalls will be signaled in accordance with rule 29.1. In addition, the race committee may attempt

to promptly broadcast the sail number or name of each recalled boat on VHF channel 69.

11.2 The following shall not be grounds for redress:

Failure of a boat to receive the recall broadcast,
Failure of the race committee to broadcast proper recall numbers,
A boat's position in the sequence of broadcast numbers,
The promptness of the broadcast, if any.

12. THE FINISH

12.1 The finishing line will be between a staff displaying a blue flag on the Race Committee signal boat at the port end of the line and a orange or white mark (Hippity Hop) at the starboard end (as viewed from the windward mark) or the regular Wednesday night finishing line if briefed at the Skippers Meeting.

13. TIME LIMIT

13.1 If no boat finishes a race within ninety minutes (90 minutes) of the start, the race shall be abandoned.

13.2 Any boat may be scored "in place" if her corrected time against the last finisher in her class eligible for a prize (based upon the number of prizes authorized under Section 19 below) plus fifteen minutes has elapsed, and she has not yet finished.

14. PROTESTS

14.1 Boats wishing to file a protest shall file a written declaration of the protest on a "US Sailing Protest Form"

available online or at the CCYC Front Desk and shall be submitted to the RC Chairman within forty-five (45)

minutes after the time of the docking of the race committee signal boat.

14.2 Protesting boats must notify the race committee at the finishing line if they intend on filing a protest.

14.3 Protest notices will be posted on the Official Notice Board within one-half hour of the Protest Time limit to

inform competitors where and when there is a hearing in which they are interested parties.

14.4 The protest committee will hear protests in approximately the order of receipt.

15. SAFETY

15.1 A boat retiring from a race or the event shall notify the RC at the first reasonable opportunity.

15.2 Skippers shall review the BYC Emergency Action card as well as the Safety Notification of Spoil Areas

prior to racing. These documents are listed on Regatta Network. Having each document onboard is highly

recommended.

16. RADIO COMMUNICATION

All radio communication between competitors and RC will be on channel 69 VHF.

17. LIABILITY

Registering for and entering the Regatta shall in no way hold CCYC, its officers, committee persons, and/or any

sponsoring group liable for injury to participants, crew, or yachts.

18. SCORING

15.1 Appendix A, Low Point Scoring system will apply.

15.2 No races shall be excluded. This modifies Appendix A2.1.

15.3 One (1) race is required to complete the regatta.

19. AWARDS

First, second and third place awards will be awarded to each crew in each class at the completion of the regatta

based on scoring for all events and racing scheduled.
