NOTICE OF RACE

ORGANIZING AUTHORITY- Hobie Fleet 204 in conjunction with the Hobie Class Association of North America (HCANA)

VENUE – The waters of Oneida Lake. Oneida Shores Park, 9400 Bartell Rd. Brewerton, NY

RULES - The regatta will be governed by rules as defined by the 2025-2028 Racing Rules of Sailing

ELIGIBILITY- The event is open to boats of the Hobie Class.

HCA membership required (Weekend memberships available)

To be considered an entry in the event, a boat shall complete all registration requirements and pay all fees.

Initial classes: 16A, 16B, 16 Party Fun Fleet, Wave A, Wave B, 14, 17, 18/18M/18SX, Tiger/Wildcat/20/21

5 boats registered by 4/17/2026 are needed to constitute a class, 10 boats needed to be considered for a separate start.

Saturday May 16, 8-9AM Breakfast, 10 AM first warning, Reunion activities TBD, Dinner 6pm, Rum squall and party to follow

Sunday May 17, 8-9AM breakfast, 10AM First warning, No warning signal after 2:04PM, Lunch and Awards after last race.

SAILING INSTRUCTIONS - The sailing instructions will be posted online on the RegattaNetwork Madcatter website prior to the first day of the event.

COMMUNICATION – Competitors may bring a VHF radio. While racing, except in an emergency, a boat shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats.

EQUIPMENT INSPECTION – Competitors are responsible for ensuring their equipment is class legal according to their Class Rules. Boats and Crews may also be subject to inspection or weigh-in at any time during the event, including registration.

COURSES – Courses to be sailed will be described in the sailing instructions.

PENALTY SYSTEM – RRS 44.1 is changed so that the Two-Turn Penalty is replaced by the One-Turn Penalty.

SCORING – One race is required to constitute a series. When fewer than four (4) races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores. When four or more races have been completed, a boat's score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.

RISK STATEMENT - RRS 3 states: The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue to race is hers alone.' By participating in this event each competitor agrees and acknowledges that sailing is a potentially dangerous activity with inherent risks. These risks include strong winds and rough seas, sudden changes in weather, failure of equipment, boat handling errors, poor seamanship by other boats, loss of balance on an unstable platform and fatigue resulting in increased risk of injury. Inherent in the sport of sailing is the risk of permanent, catastrophic injury or death by drowning, trauma, hypothermia or other causes.

INSURANCE - Each participating boat shall have valid third-party insurance—minimum coverage of not less than \$100,000 USD per incident or equivalent and list the type of boat insured, insured boat hull number and the amount the boat is insured for.
