





Notice of Race Island Fever Regatta

South Beach Yacht Club – A Mid-Winter Series 2010 - 2011 November 20 – December 18 – January 15 – February 19 – March 19

South Beach Yacht Club is the Organizing Authority.

Rules, Eligibility and Event Classification

- This regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in Racing Rules of Sailing.
- All boats are invited to participate.
- Each boat shall have a 2010 Northern California PHRF or BAMA handicap certificate or be a class-legal, one design whose class is a member of SF Bay ODCA, WBRA, or US Sailing.
- Those boats without certificates will be assigned a PHRF rating at the sole and un-appealable discretion of the Race Committee.
- Advertising is restricted to Category A.
- RRS 40 is changed: All competitors are required to wear a life jacket or other adequate personal floatation device while racing; the Y flag will not be displayed.
- Single race entries are not eligible for the series trophies.

Entries, Registration, Competitors' Briefing

- Eligible boats must enter and pay on-line at www.southbeachyacht club.org.
- Only on-line entries and payments will be accepted.
- Deadline to enter without a late fee is November 16, 2010.
- Series Entry fees are: \$40 for US Sailing Members; \$45 Non-US Sailing Members \$45; Single Race fee: \$15.
- Series Entry fees received after November 16 are \$50.
- There will be no Competitors' Briefing.

Sailing Instructions

- The Sailing Instructions will be available by 1700 hours on Tuesday, November 16th on South Beach Yacht Club's website located at www.southbeachyachtclub.org and at the club house.
- Changes to the Sailing Instructions will be posted in the south window of SBYC no later than 1130 hours on the day of each race.

Courses and Racing Area

- The races will be held in the South and Central waters of San Francisco Bay.
- Courses will use fixed marks or landmarks such as islands.
- The Start and Finish lines will be at the entrance to McCovey Cove in the South Bay.

Schedule of Races

- Five races are scheduled: November 20, December 18, January 15, February 19, and March 19.
- The schedule for the first warning signal is 1230 hours.

Scoring

- Time on Distance will be used calculated to the nearest second.
- Two races are required to be completed to constitute a series.
- When four or more races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her one worst score.
- This changes Appendix A.2.

Prizes

• Prizes for First, Second and Third place for each division will be awarded following the last race at a club-hosted reception.

Hospitality

• Skippers, their crew and guests are invited to SBYC after each race.
