NOTICE OF RACE

The Organizing Authority is South Beach Yacht Club



1. Rules, Eligibility and Event Classification

- a. This regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in Racing Rules of Sailing.
- b. All boats are invited to participate.
- c. Each boat shall have a 2011 Northern California PHRF or BAMA handicap certificate or be a class-legal, one design whose class is a member of SF Bay ODCA, WBRA, or US Sailing.
- d. Those boats without certificates will be assigned a PHRF rating at the sole and un-appealable discretion of the Race Committee.
- e. Advertising is restricted to Category A.
- f. RRS 40 is changed: All competitors are required to wear a life jacket or other adequate personal floatation device while racing; the Y flag will not be displayed.
- g. Single race entries are not eligible for the series trophies.

2. Entries, Registration, Competitors' Briefing

- a. Eligible boats must enter and pay on-line at www.southbeachyachtclub.org/racing.
- b. Only on-line entries and payments will be accepted.
- c. Deadline to enter without a late fee is November 17, 2010, 23:59.
- d. Series Entry fees are: \$45 for US Sailing Members; \$50 Non-US Sailing Members; Single Race fee: \$15.
- e. Series Entry fees received after November 17 are \$55.
- f. There will be no Competitors' Briefing.

3. Sailing Instructions

- a. The Sailing Instructions will be available by 1700 hours on Tuesday, November 16th on South Beach Yacht Club's website located at www.southbeachyachtclub.org/racing and at the club house.
- b. Changes to the Sailing Instructions will be posted in the south window of SBYC no later than 1130 hours on the day of each race.

4. Schedule of Races

- a. Five races are scheduled: Nov. 19 (2011), Dec. 17 (2011), Jan. 21 (2012), February 18 (2012), and March 17 (2012).
- b. The schedule for the first warning signal is 1230 hours.

5. Courses and Racing Area

- a. The races will be held in the South and Central waters of San Francisco Bay.
- b. Courses will use fixed marks or landmarks such as islands.
- c. The Start and Finish lines will be at the entrance to McCovey Cove in the South Bay.

6. Scoring

- a. Time on Distance will be used calculated to the nearest second.
- b. Two races are required to be completed to constitute a series.
- c. When four or more races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her one worst score.
- d. This changes Appendix A.2.

7. Prizes

- a. Prizes for First, Second and Third place for each division will be awarded following the last race at a club-hosted reception.

8. Disclaimer of Liability

- a. Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See rule 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.
