1 RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the current Racing Rules of Sailing, together with the rules of the participating classes and any additional sailing instructions to be issued at the competitors' meeting.

2 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 2.1 The regatta is open to all boats of the International 505, A-Class catamaran, Nacra 20, and F16 classes.

2.2 Registration:

3 FEES

- 3.1 Required fees are as follows:

A-Cat and single-handed F16	\$45 includes one (1) Saturday dinner
505, Nacra 20, and double-handed F16	\$65 includes two (2) Saturday dinners
Non-US Sailing member additional fee	\$5
Late (on-site) registration add	\$10
Extra dinner	\$16 per person

4 BEVERAGES

- Cash bar is available after racing Saturday.
- Please note that alcoholic beverages must be obtained from the bar as a condition of our liquor license.

5 SCHEDULE

5.1 Saturday

- 0830 Late registration (on-site) open
0930 Late registration (on-site) closed
0930 Competitors' meeting (at flagpole or inside if raining)
1100 First warning signal for all catamaran classes
International 505 Class: First warning signal will be after 1200 (noon)

The Race Committee (RC) will announce the order of starts for the first race at the competitors' meeting.

5.2 Sunday

- 1030 First warning signal
1430 No races will start after this time
Awards to follow racing

5.3 Number of Races:

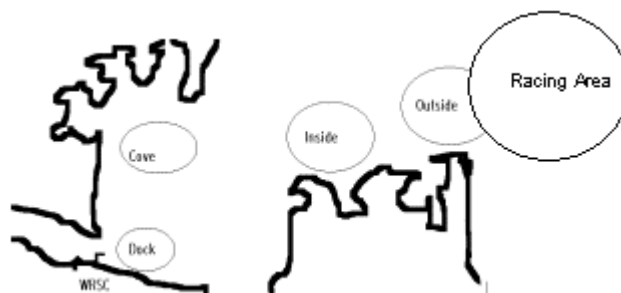
There is no limit to the number of races. The committee will attempt to maximize racing for the conditions available.

6 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS / COMPETITORS' MEETING

A competitors' meeting to review any amendments to the Sailing Instructions will be held on Saturday. See schedule above for time.

7 VENUE

- 7.1 The venue shall be finalized by the RC on race day. WRSC typically races on the West River or on the west side of the bay just outside of the river entrance.



8 THE COURSE

The courses will be windward-leeward, twice around, with course length set for a race duration of about 30-60 minutes, or as described at the competitor's meeting.

9 PENALTY SYSTEM

9.1 The penalties are as follows: Rule 44 of RRS

9.2 For the catamaran classes (Nacra 20, F16 and A Class) rules 44.1 and 44.2 are changed so that only one turn, including one tack and one gybe, is required.

9.3 Decisions of the protest committee will be final as provided in rule 70.4.

10 SCORING

10.1 The scoring system is as follows Low Point Scoring System found in Appendix A.

10.2 One (1) race is required to be completed to constitute a series.

- (a) When fewer than 5 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.
 - (b) When from 5 to 11 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.
 - (c) When 12 or more races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her two worst scores.

11 SUPPORT BOATS

Support boats shall be marked with the letters WRSC or as described at the competitor's meeting.

12 CHECK-IN

Before starting their first race of the day, all competitors shall sail astern the starting boat, give their sail number and be acknowledged by the RC. Any competitor who leaves the race area before the completion of racing shall attempt to notify the RC before leaving the race area.

13 RADIO COMMUNICATION

A boat shall neither make radio transmissions while racing nor receive radio communications not available to all boats. This restriction also applies to mobile telephones, but does not apply to communication received or transmitted to request or render assistance to a vessel in distress or to notify RC that a competitor is leaving the race area.

14 PRIZES

Prizes will be given to the top 3 places for each class.

15 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See rule 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.

Scores and notices will be posted on the back window of the clubhouse.
