

2014 Spring Starlight Series Notice of Race



Five Wednesday Night Races - April 16, 23, 30, May 7, 14 Corinthian Sailing Association and Southern Yacht Club Non-Spinnaker Only

1. Rules

Races will be governed by rules as defined in the 2013-2016 ed. Racing Rules of Sailing, CSA General Sailing Instructions (SI's) and the GYA PHRF Bylaws. CSA SI's are available online at: http://csa.johnwdixon.com/Sailing_files.asp If any of these rules conflict, this NOR governs.

2. Eligibility and Entry

- 2.1 Register online for the entire series at: http://www.regattanetwork.com/event/8199 Please DO NOT Re-Register for individual races within this series. Register only once for this 5 race Series. Re-Registration for each race is **not** necessary.
- 2.2 Entry fee FREE
- 2.2 The Spring Starlight Series is a Non-Spinnaker only event. Boats who normally do not participate in races are encouraged to participate. Boats that normally race in spinnaker classes are encouraged to use this series as an opportunity to invite, recruit, and train new crew members.
- 2.3 PHRF Rating. A copy of a boat's current GYA PHRF Certificate must be on file with CSA Race Committee prior to the start of the first race of a Series. Boats without a current GYA PHRF certificate on file will be assigned a temporary rating by the Race Committee equal to the GYA rating for similar boats, less six (-6) seconds per mile. Boats without a current GYA PHRF Certificate may apply for a certificate online at: http://www.gya.org/documents/phrf/PHRFCertApp.pdf
- 2.4 Boats that do not meet the GYA PHRF definition of a Standard PHRF Boat may sail under a GYA X-PHRF certificate. X-PHRF certificates may be obtained online at the above link.

3. Schedule of Events

- 3.1 Skipper's Meeting / Registration non-mandatory at SYC ground floor west side on Tuesday April 16 at 1900.
- 3.2 Races are scheduled for five (5) consecutive Wednesday nights as listed above.
- 3.3 The first start is scheduled at 7:00 pm. Each class will have its own start. There will be 5 classes.
- 3.4 Following each race, results will be announced in the Southern Yacht Club bar on the third floor.
- Following each race, SYC will grill hamburgers and the bar will be open. Non members of SYC are welcome to purchase food and drink tickets in the bar area.

4. Rating Bands

- 4.1 Class Breaks and starting order will be: A to 99, B 102 to 135, C 138 to 165, D 168 to 195, E 198 Up. Rating bands and class breaks will be posted on Race Committee boat before each race, and announced over VHF radio channel 68 prior to each start.
- 4.2 Class flags will be numeral pennants corresponding to the class breaks and order of start.

5. Scoring

- 5.1 Classes will be scored using the Low Point System with points accumulated within a boats class.
- 5.2 Overall standings will be scored using the Low Point System with points accumulated from fleet standings of races in which all classes sail the same course. If a race is abandoned or shortened for some but not all classes, scores from that race will not count for scoring overall scores.
- 5.3 Three races constitute a Series. One throw-out if four or more races are completed.

6. Check-In

- Boats shall check-in with the Race Committee boat on the water prior to each race. Boats that fail to check-in on the water are subject to protest and disqualification.
- Boats that withdraw from a race after checking in shall inform the Race Committee immediately. Boats failing to notify the Race Committee immediately after withdrawing are subject to protest and disqualification for the entire series. This changes rule 63.1

7. Trophies

- 7.1 Champagne will be awarded to top finishers in each class, after each race. Overall Awards will be presented at Southern Yacht Club following the last race of the Series.
- 7.2 Overall Trophies will be awarded to the top three boats in each class. The first place boat in each class for the series will be awarded an individual custom trophy.
- 7.3 Overall fleet winner will be presented the Seabrook Marine Perpetual Overall Fleet Champion Award.

8. Safety

8.1 All boats shall display lighted port, starboard, and stern running lights the entire time while racing. Boats that fail to comply will be disqualified for the race without a hearing. This changes rule 63.1

9. Disclaimer of Liability

Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See rule 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.
