On-site Registration/Check-In

This will be open on Monday, August 4th from 1:00pm to 5:30pm. If you are flying into Traverse City, upon arrival at <u>Traverse City-Cherry Capital Airport</u>, proceed directly to our Event Check-In Table near the departure gate (Look for the GTYC/TACS Burgees and the US Sailing Logo). The event transportation team will make arrangements to transport you to GTYC. The transportation desk will be manned for all arrival flights.

If you are driving please go directly to the Registration desk at GTYC (13653 S. West Bay Shore Dr. Traverse City MI. 49684) between 1:00 PM and 5:30 PM Monday. The registration team will confirm that all forms have been correctly submitted and information regarding the upcoming week will be distributed. All competitors' life jackets will be inspected at registration, as will harnesses for Club 420. Please refer to the NOR for PFD & harness requirements.

Housing assignments will be distributed upon completion of registration, but competitors will remain at GTYC through dinner. Charter boats and spinnakers will be assigned at the beginning of the Racing Clinic on Tuesday morning. After registration, the beach and recreation areas of the club will be open until dinner is called, during which we will have several speakers. Host families will arrive to take competitors home at 8:00pm.

EVENT ARRIVAL and DEPARTURE TIMES:

Early arrivals are not permitted – no exceptions. Being "Invited" by a GTYC or TACS member is *not* an exception to this rule. Violations will be dealt with strictly by the Organizing Committee and may be passed to the Protest Committee. All competitors should plan to arrive at GTYC between 1:00pm and 5:30pm on Monday, August 4th.

Competitors may depart the event after the Awards Ceremony by car, with a parent or guardian, or on the airport van. Please indicate when you register how you will be departing. If you are riding the provided airport van, please remember to include payment of \$20 with your registration. No person will be allowed to leave the premises without the proper information on file.

FOR YOUR OWN SAFETY, DO NOT ACCEPT RIDES OR TRANSPORTATION to or from Grand Traverse Yacht Club that have not been pre-arranged by you or a member of your family.

AIRPORT INFORMATION:

ARRIVAL - US Sailing has negotiated a discount code from United Airlines for travel to the 2014 championships. The website to apply our discount is http://membership.ussailing.org/sailors/United.htm. The discount code is ZRS9309462.

Flights to and from Traverse City are limited. To help you arrange flights we have engaged the services of a local travel agent. We encourage you to use the services of Passageways Travel by



contacting Ms. Tammy Sofonia at 231-486-2174 or e-mail tammy.sofonia@passagewaystravel.com). Please reference US Junior Championships

It is highly recommended that for competitors arriving by air, you book flights arriving to and departing from <u>Traverse City-Cherry Capital Airport</u>, which is approximately 20 minutes from GTYC. All other Michigan airports are at least 3-4 hours from Traverse City and are <u>NOT</u> recommended.

Parents who use alternate airports will need to make their own arrangements for transportation to and from the event and ensure sufficient time for the sailors to arrive and depart within the timeframes of the event. Departing flights should not be scheduled prior to 11:00 PM.

The event transportation team has made arrangements to transport you from the Traverse City-Cherry Capital Airport to GTYC and return to the airport at the event's close. We have vans available for transportation to and from the airport with advance reservation at a rate of \$20/person (round trip). Reservation should be booked and paid for by check (to Traverse Area Community Sailing - Chubb) and mailed with your registration materials.

Traverse City has limited flight service and we highly recommend that flights be booked as soon as possible to guarantee on time arrival.

DEPARTURE - **Departure** for all competitors will be on Friday, August 8th following the awards ceremony Flights should be scheduled for departure no earlier than 8:00pm on Friday. Requests for early or late departures must be made with US Sailing's Liz Walker at lizwalker@ussailing.org at least two weeks in advance. **Please DO NOT make flight** arrangements outside these windows until the request has been approved. No event housing will be provided to competitors for Saturday night or later.

Competitors flying as Unaccompanied Minors or are 15 or under should contact the airline for special instructions and fees.

For competitors travelling to the U.S. Youth Championships in Grosse Pointe from the U.S. Junior Championships in Traverse City, MI, Passageways Travel may be able to arrange a charter bus direct to GPYC. This service will **only** be available if sufficient numbers of sailors subscribe to this service **prior to** July 21, 2014. **It is not guaranteed.**

TRAVEL DELAYS, CHANGES OR QUESTIONS:

Any "day-of" questions regarding transportation on August 4, should be directed to the GTYC office, 231-946-9779. It is important that arrival and departure information be included as part of your registration.

If your plans change after the July 25th deadline, please e-mail the registrar, Ms. Sherry Phelps at Chubb_Registration@gtyc.org. Changes in your travel schedule can be made prior to arrival but we ask that we receive all changes no later than August 1. Please be sure to go into your registration and update the information there as well.

DRIVING INSTRUCTIONS:

Local competitors may drive to GTYC for registration. The Drivers' Release must be completed on the Transportation Form and submitted with other required documents prior to arrival. No competitors' cars will be left at GTYC for the duration of the Junior Championships. Car keys will be held by GTYC and returned upon conclusion of the Awards Ceremony on Friday. There will be no driving of personal cars during the regatta. Offenders will be dealt with strictly.

MEDICAL FORM:

Each competitor must send a fully completed Medical Form along with all of the required waivers to Chubb_Registration@gtyc.org or to the address on the bottom of the form by July 26. Please attach a copy of the insurance card to the Medical Form. If any medical issues change after July 26, it is the responsibility of the parent/competitor to notify the regatta Registrar.

HOUSING:

<u>US Sailing Regulation 10.01</u> will be in effect from the moment a competitor arrives at the venue until he/she is home or at the airport. Offenders will be dealt with strictly as stated in the Notice of Race.

<u>All</u> competitors will be assigned to a host family at registration. Shortly after arrival at the host families' home, competitors are asked to share the host families' and event co-chairs' contact info with their parents. Please remember that these families have generously offered to have competitors as guests in their homes and please behave accordingly. A tidy, helpful, considerate, and thankful guest is always appreciated.

Transportation to and from the Yacht Club will be by walking or by the host family if not within walking distance. Attendance at all events is required.

MEALS:

Meals for each competitor will be provided throughout the regatta. A Continental Breakfast and Lunch Buffet will be served at the club each day. Dinners will be served at GTYC each night. The



awards ceremony will be Friday evening at GTYC upon the completion of boat pack-up. Please list dietary restrictions at online registration AND on the Medical Form.

PACK-UP

Failure to assist in the pack-up will result in forfeiture of \$250 of the damage deposit and may result in a competitor not receiving a charter at a future US Sailing event.

AWARDS CEREMONY

The awards ceremony is on Friday, August 8th. Attendance by competitors is **mandatory** and is included in your entry fee. Competitors will not be allowed to leave before the Awards Ceremony and pack up of the boats without prior approval of the National Chair and will only be granted for extenuating circumstances. **Under no circumstances** will competitors be allowed to depart prior to the completion of the boat pack up.

CHARTER BOAT ASSIGNMENT:

Charter fees will be paid online by the stated deadline of July 26th. **Damage Deposit Forms and deposit must be returned with paperwork.** All boats will be provided fully equipped and no changes to the rigging, sheeting, blocks, or sails will be permitted. Doublehanded teams should bring their own bridle and harness.

Representatives from Zim Sailing will be on site at GTYC. Sears competitors will charter GTYC Club members' Interlakes, and will be issued a spinnaker for their team's use (to be carried with the team as they rotate boats). Competitors will be expected to help prepare and rig their own boats each day and install the provided hull and sail numbers following registration. It is the competitor's/team's responsibility to leave the charter boat in clean and good condition at the end of each day. Boats will be inspected each evening.

On Friday, August 8th all competitors will assist in the de-rigging, final check-in, and loading of charter boats for transport. Sailors will not be released to the Awards Dinner until all the boats have been checked in and loaded.

CREW CHANGES:

An Alternate is named on the entry form at the first level of competition, and may not be changed in the competitive year. Please refer to NOR 4.1 - 4.6. Crew changes will be granted only if there is a valid reason (see the championship conditions for specifics). Sailors who wish to change sailing partners must submit a request in writing confirming a legitimate reason.

Requests should be e-mailed to Liz Walker at US Sailing at lizwalker@ussailing.org. An Alternate should be provided to your Area Representative at the time of qualification. It is important to plan well in advance in an effort to retain original teams unless a true emergency arises.



RACING CLINIC:

Racing Clinics will be held at GTYC and Elmwood Township Marina (Sears), on Tuesday, August 5th from **10:00am – 6:30pm**. These clinics will cover charter boat assignment, rigging and handling of the boats, starts, and practice races.

Participation in the clinics is mandatory. NO EXCEPTIONS

PRIVATE COACHES ARE NOT PERMITTED

RACING AREA:

ONLY FLAGGED SUPPORT BOATS WILL BE PERMITTED IN THE RACING AREA. No private support boats are permitted. Please review US Sailing's Spectator and Coach Boat policy and refer to NOR sections 18-19.

SAILING INSTRUCTIONS:

GEAR:

Personal Flotation Device (life Jacket) USCG approved only & harness-Type III or V (Club 420) are mandatory. Hat, sunglasses, sunscreen and light weight sun protective rash guard are all highly recommended. Dress for dinner is clean and casual. Shirts and shoes are to be worn in the club house – no wet bathing suits. The Awards Ceremony at GTYC is a bit more formal – collared shirt, dress, nice slacks. Mark all personal belongings in advance – clothes, equipment, gear.

WEATHER:

Weather information will be provided each race day on the official regatta bulletin board. In August, Grand Traverse Bay water temp will be 65 degrees Fahrenheit. Air temperature will likely be in the 70's – 80's (colder temps are possible) but the sun may be intense. The wind often is at 8-10 kts from the North to Northwest at noon and 10-13 at 2:pm. This direction produces 1-2 ft. waves that occasionally max at occasional white caps. The sea breeze begins easing down at 5:00 PM and is noticeably decreased by 6:pm. Daytime air temperatures in August range from 65 to 85 degrees, with night-time lows in the 55 to 65 degrees. Water temperature is 65 degrees. ALCOHOL AND DRUGS:

Per US Sailing Regulation 10.10.01: The use of alcohol or any illegal drug by a competitor will not be allowed or tolerated during the event. Offenders will be dealt with strictly as stated in the Notice of Race.



CURFEW:

There will be a 10:00pm curfew during the event; meaning that ALL competitors must be "home" where they are being housed by 10:00pm each night. These regulations are in effect from Monday, August 6th through Friday, August 10th. For safety reasons, there will be no exceptions.

COMPETITORS ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR BRINGING THE FOLLOWING:

- Personal Flotation Device (life Jacket) USCG approved only & harness-Type III or V (Club 420). NO EXCEPTIONS.
- Compass/bracket
- Appropriate sailing gear and clothing for a range of weather conditions, particularly sun precaution
- Sunscreen, sunglasses and hat
- A water bottle- clearly labeled
- Notebook, pen, US Sailing Rules of Sailing
- Appropriate attire for the awards dinner collared shirts, dresses or nice slacks

WHAT IS A CONCUSSION?

A concussion is a type of traumatic brain injury that changes the way the brain normally works. A concussion is caused by a fall, bump, blow, or jolt to the head or body that causes the head and brain to move quickly back and forth. A concussion can be caused by a shaking, spinning or a sudden stopping and starting of the head. Even a "ding," "getting your bell rung," or what seems to be a mild bump or blow to the head can be serious. A concussion can happen even if you haven't been knocked out.

You can't see a concussion. Signs and symptoms of concussions can show up right after the injury or may not appear or be noticed until days or weeks after the injury. If the sailor reports any symptoms of a concussion, or if you notice symptoms yourself, seek medical attention right away. A sailor who may have had a concussion should not return on the water on the day of the injury and until a health care professional says they are okay to return on the water.

IF YOU SUSPECT A CONCUSSION:

- **1. SEEK MEDICAL ATTENTION RIGHT AWAY** A health care professional will be able to decide how serious the concussion is and when it is safe for the sailor to return to regular activities, including sports. Don't hide it, report it. Ignoring symptoms and trying to "tough it out" often makes it worse.
- **2. KEEP YOUR SAILOR OUT OF PLAY** Concussions take time to heal. Don't let the sailor return on the water the day of injury and until a heath care professional says it's okay. A sailor who returns on the water too soon, while the brain is still healing, risks a greater chance of having a second concussion. Young children and teens are more likely to get a concussion and take longer to recover than adults. Repeat or second concussions increase the time it takes to recover and can be very serious. They can cause permanent brain damage, affecting the sailor for a lifetime. They can be fatal. It is better to miss one game than the whole season.
- **3. TELL THE STAFF ABOUT ANY PREVIOUS CONCUSSION** Regatta organizers should know if a sailor had a previous concussion. A sailor's regatta organizers may not know about a concussion received in another sport or activity unless you notify them.

SIGNS OBSERVED BY PARENTS:

Appears dazed or stunned

- Is confused about assignment or position
- · Forgets an instruction
- Can't recall events prior to or after a hit or fall
- Is unsure of game, score, or opponent
- Moves clumsily
- Answers questions slowly

- Loses consciousness (even briefly)
- Shows mood, behavior, or personality changes

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CONCUSSION DANGER SIGNS:

In rare cases, a dangerous blood clot may form on the brain in a person with a concussion and crowd the brain against the skull. A sailor should receive immediate medical attention if after a bump, blow, or jolt to the head or body s/he exhibits any of the following danger signs:

- · One pupil larger than the other
- Is drowsy or cannot be awakened
- A headache that gets worse
- Weakness, numbness, or decreased coordination
- Repeated vomiting or nausea
- Slurred speech

- Convulsions or seizures
- Cannot recognize people/places
- Becomes increasingly confused, restless or agitated
- Has unusual behavior
- Loses consciousness (even a brief loss of consciousness should be taken seriously.)

HOW TO RESPOND TO A REPORT OF A CONCUSSION:

If a sailor reports one or more symptoms of a concussion after a bump, blow, or jolt to the head or body, s/he should be kept out of athletic play the day of the injury. The sailor should only return on the water with permission from a health care professional experienced in evaluating for concussion. During recovery, rest is key. Exercising or activities that involve a lot of concentration (such as studying, working on the computer, or playing video games) may cause concussion symptoms to reappear or get worse. Sailors who return to the regatta after a concussion may need to spend fewer hours at regatta organizers, take rests breaks, be given extra help and time, spend less time reading, writing or on a computer. After a concussion, returning to sports and regatta organizers is a gradual process that should be monitored by a health care professional. Remember: Concussion affects people differently. While most sailors with a concussion recover quickly and fully, some will have symptoms that last for days, or even weeks. A more serious concussion can last for months or longer.
