NOTICE OF RACE

1 RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in:
 - 1.1.1 The Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS);
 - 1.1.2 Current class rules for one design fleets;
 - 1.1.3 The current PHRF regulations, as administered by YRA of Long Island Sound (YRALIS) including non-spinnaker regulations and crew weight limitations;
 - 1.1.4 Current minimum equipment and safety recommendations of YRALIS, Category C;
 - 1.1.5 Except as any of these are changed by this Notice of Race or the Sailing Instructions.

2 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 2.1 The regatta is open to boats racing under PHRF and one-design rules.
- 2.2 Eligible boats can enter and electronically pay the entry fee using the online registration at www.lhyc.org, following the link to the Race Information page. Online entry is required. Paper entries will not be accepted. Boats shall enter in only one class.
- 2.3 If less than four entries are received for any one-design class, they will be entered in an appropriate PHRF class, unless they wish to withdraw their entry.
- 2.4 Entry must be submitted including a valid rating certificate and entry fee received by LHYC no later than Friday, May 30, 2014.

3 FEES

3.1 Early registration entry fee is \$65 per boat for US SAILING members and \$75 for non-US SAILING members.

3.1.1 Entrants may make an additional donation to the Huntington Lighthouse Preservation Society while entering if they so desire.

3.2 For entries received after Friday, May 30, 2014, the entry fee is \$85 for US SAILING members and \$95 for non-US SAILING members.

3.3 All entries must be received by 1800 hours, Friday May 30, 2014.

4 QUALIFYING SERIES

4.1 YRALIS qualifier for Gitana, Sappho, Competitors, Kings Point & Mertz Trophies

5 SCHEDULE

5.1 Racing is scheduled for Saturday, May 31, 2014. Two races will be held, conditions permitting.

5.2 The Huntington Day Race will be held first followed immediately by the Lloyd's Trophy Race.

5.3 The first warning signal for the Huntington Day Race will be signaled at 1100 hours.

5.4 The first warning signal for the Lloyd's Trophy Race will be signaled as soon as practicable after the finish of the first race.

6 MEASUREMENTS

6.1 To race in a PHRF spinnaker class, a boat shall have a current and valid YRALIS PHRF certificate on file with the YRALIS or produce a certificate with the entry, or apply for a temporary handicap rating from the LHYC Fleet Captain.

6.2 To race in a one design class, a boat shall have evidence of compliance with class rules, or a valid one-design certificate, or receive a temporary waiver and LHYC handicap rating from the LHYC Fleet Captain.

6.3 To race in the non-spinnaker class, a boat shall have a current and valid YRALIS PHRF certificate on file with the YRALIS or submit a certificate with the entry, or apply for a temporary handicap rating from the LHYC Fleet Captain.

7 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

7.1 The Sailing Instructions and Scratch Sheets will be posted and available on the LHYC website (www.lhyc.org) no later than June 1, 2014, and conditions permitting, from race committee boats on race day.

8 VENUE

8.1 The racing area will be Long Island Sound in the vicinity of Nun "6" in Huntington Bay NY.

9 THE COURSES

9.1 The course for all classes will be indicated by the race committee and be comprised of a combination of government and temporary marks.

10 SCORING

10.1 All classes will be scored in each race using the handicaps provided by the YRALIS and course distance as calculated by the race committee, regardless of the distance sailed.

11 RADIO COMMUNICATION

11.1 The race committee shall use VHF channel 72 for any radio communications with competitors. As an additional courtesy, radio prompts may be given to preface any actions by the race committee. Boats shall not be entitled to redress for the following: misstatements by the race committee, or failure of a boat to hear or receive a broadcast.

11.2 Except in an emergency, a boat shall neither make radio transmissions while racing nor receive radio communications not available to all boats. This restriction also applies to mobile telephones.

12 PRIZES

12.1 Prizes will be awarded as follows for each class: First if 3 or more competitors, Second if 5 or more, Third if 7 or more, and Fourth if 11 or more.

12.2 The F. Rogers Ketcham Trophy will be awarded to the Huntington YC boat, 30 feet LOA or over, having the best corrected time in the PHRF classes, competing in the Huntington Day Race.

12.3 The R. Finesmith Trophy will be awarded to the Huntington YC boat having the best corrected time in the Club Class (i.e., Jib and Main) for the Huntington Day Race.

12.4 The Lloyd's Trophy will be awarded to the best PHRF spinnaker fleet boat with the lowest corrected time in the Lloyd's Trophy Race (one year retention).

12.5 The Huntington Bay Championship Trophy will be awarded to the best performing boat in both the Huntington Day Race and the Lloyd's Trophy Race as determined by the regatta committee.

12.6 Qualifying race for the Schuster Trophy – awarded to the best overall Lloyd Harbor Yacht Club boat in the combined Lloyd's Trophy, Stratford Shoal Race and Katrina Cup using Cox-Sprague scoring based upon fleet placement.

12.7 Each race is a qualifying race for the North Sail's *Huntington Bay Boat of the Year* Trophy. Participation earns one point per race.

12.8 Participation in the Huntington Bay Championship is a qualifier for the North Sail's Charity Cup.

12.9 Lloyd Harbor Yacht Club prizes will be awarded at the LHYC annual awards dinner on November 8, 2014.

13 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

13.1 Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See RRS 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage, or personal injury, or death sustained in conjunction with, or prior to, during, or after the regatta.

13.2 Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance.

14 OTHER

14.1 Event proceeds are designated to benefit the Huntington Lighthouse Preservation Society.

14.2 Competitors and their guests are invited to Huntington Yacht Club in Huntington, NY, Saturday, May 31, after racing, for a BBQ; \$20 fee payable at the door. www.huntingtonyachtclub.com

14.3 Limited guest moorings will be available to boats entered in the series on a first come first served basis at Huntington Yacht Club. Please contact the Dock Master at 631-427-4961 x 108 to make arrangements.
