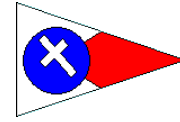

2014 PREDICTED LOG CONTEST

OCTOBER 18, 2014

1 Rules

- 1.1 The contest will be governed by the rules as defined in the SCYC Rules for the Conduct of Predicted Log Navigation Contests.
- 1.2 All are required to maintain at least a 5-knot average speed.
- 1.3 A minimum of 3 competitors is required to constitute a fleet, and the organizers will assign boats of similar design and speed to the various fleets.
- 1.4 Each entrant shall provide one adult to act as the observer on another boat.

2 Eligibility and Entry

- 2.1 This series is open to any power or sailboat based in the Santa Cruz Yacht Harbor.
- 2.2 Eligible boats may enter by completing the online entry form at www.regattanetwork.com/event/9234 or scyc.org.
- 2.3 Only online entries will be accepted.

3 Fees

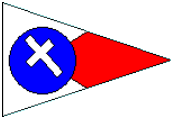
- 3.1 Regular entry fee is \$10 if received by 2000 hours October 10, 2014.
- 3.2 Late entry fee is \$15 if received after 2000 hours October 10, 2014
- 3.3 Registration closes at 1000 hours October 18, 2014
- 3.4 All entry fees are nonrefundable.

4 Schedules

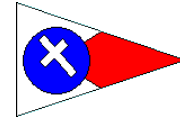
- 4.1 A mandatory competitors' meeting will be at 1030 hours on October 18, 2014 at the SCYC clubhouse. Competitors will turn in their predicted logs and observers will be assigned at this time.
- 4.2 The scheduled time of the first start is 1200 on October 18, 2014.
- 4.3 There will be an awards ceremony at the SCYC clubhouse on October 18, 2014 at approximately 5 pm.

5 Contest Instructions

- 5.1 The Contest Instructions will include the course and marks, and will be posted online by 1800 hours on October 4, 2014 at scyc.org
- 5.2 The course length will be approximately 12 miles.

6 Venue

6.1 The Contest will be around fixed buoys in Monterey Bay. The racing area will be bounded by Aptos to the southeast, Santa Cruz point to the west, and extending up to three miles off shore.

7 Scoring

7.1 Scoring will be based on the percentage error between the predicted and actual times at each checkpoint as defined in the SCYC Rules for the Conduct of Predicted Log Navigation Contests.

8 Prizes

8.1 Prizes will be given at the discretion of the organizing authority, but will include at least one prize for each active fleet.

9. Disclaimer of Liability

9.1 Competitors participate in the Contest entirely at their own risk, and the responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in the contest or to continue in the contest is hers alone. See rule 19, the Safety Rule.

9.2 The SCYC will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during or after the Contest.

10 Further Information

10.1 There will be a non-mandatory educational seminar on Predicted Log Contests to be held at the SCYC (lower level) at 7pm on October 16, 2014.
