

SCYC 2014 PREDICTED LOG CONTEST								
<b>SKIPPER'S PREDICTED LOG</b>								
1. The Contestant shall predict the time (H:M:S) at each mark, assuming a 1200 noon start, recording their prediction in the Skipper's Time column.								
The Skipper will turn this Predicted Log into the Contest Committee prior to the contest								
2. As a check point is approached, the Observer will take warning when the Contestant calls "Stand By", then "Get Ready". At the								
call of "Mark", the Observer will read the watch time and record it in the Observer's Time space in the Observer's Log.								
3. Upon return to the harbor, the Observer will turn the Observer's Log over to the Official Scorer who will compare it to the Skipper's Predicted Log								
and calculate the errors.								
4. Completed forms will then be handed to the Chairman of Contest for verification and posting.								
5. Smallest error percentage wins.
